

You MAY know that the County has approved funding to replace the grass with artificial turf on the Gunston Park Diamond Athletic Field. The bases and pitching mound will be removable so that baseball and soccer can also use the field. And, the Arlington YMCA as we know it, including the Tennis & Squash Center, will be going away.

You MAY NOT know that specific neighborhoods are lobbying to have certain softball fields removed from Arlington. Also, Wakefield and W&L have outdoor restroom facilities in the winter, but Yorktown currently does not. The good news is that new batting cages are being installed at Gunston Park, Stratford Park and Barcroft Park.
