Appendix A: District Meeting

"The Arlington Optimist Club was represented by President-elect Clayton Depue and Stephen Toth at the Capital-VA District 3rd Q meeting which was held at the Ashburn Embassy Suites on Saturday, May 6. The meeting was Chaired by Governor Gail Headley and was well attended by Optimist Club leadership and members from Virginia, Md. and D.C. The morning session included reports from District Committee Chairs concerning the status of their programs. Past Gov. Lawson Headley reported on the Cap-VA Junior Golf Qualifier which was held at the Hanover C.C, in Ashland, VA on the weekend of April 29 when 54 golfers competed in the various age and gender brackets and 21 earned the right to compete in the Florida OIJGC championship. There followed the Club President's reports. Stephen Toth, speaking on behalf of President Mark Zetlin, highlighted our membership in plus territory and on track for Honor Club status, the successful completion of our Essay and Oratorical competitions and the impressive number of contestants in both, and the memorable AOC Gala held at the WG&CC on April 21. Subsequently we received from Governor Gail engraved Certificates and pins for new Member sponsorship by Mark Zetlin, Sandy Bushue and Tricia O'Hara.

We then convened separate Zone meetings for the purpose of electing a Lt. Gov. for the 2017-18 administrative year. Anne Grabowski of the Central Fairfax Optimist Club was unanimously elected by the members of the Zone 4 Clubs present to serve another term as Lt. Gov. She used the balance of her time to encourage attendance at the Zone 4 Social she was hosting at the Elks Club in Fairfax, VA on Saturday evening, May 20. (Stephen Toth attended what turned out to be a most enjoyable Optimist event and encouraged Anne Grabowski to continue with her plan to schedule another Zone 4 Social in October).

After a hearty lunch the Cap-VA District Oratorical Contest was next on the agenda. Seven boys and eight girls, who had won Zone contests throughout the Cap-VA District, delivered their messages on the assigned topic. After a lengthy deliberation by the three senior Toastmaster judges, with Stephen Toth serving as Administrative Judge, decisions were reached and Surya Shanmugaselvam sponsored by Richmond West Central Optimist Club was the winning boy and Jay Falk sponsored by the Alexandria Optimist Club (Zone 4 winner) was the winning girl. Each has won a \$2500 scholarship and one will be selected to proceed to the further levels of OI competition based on their scoring in this contest.

After some Optimist camaraderie in the well attended Hospitality Suite, we joined the pre-dinner social and then enjoyed a good dinner. We were treated to an after dinner speaker, Rusty Foster who serves as Chairman of the Board of the Loudon County YMCA but whose day job is President of Bow Tie Strategies, a local PR firm. Rusty is a young man who shared with us some terrific ideas on how to relate to his generation with respect to community service and volunteerism.

A good time was had by all who attended this important Cap-VA District meeting."

Appendix B: Rifle Club Achievements

The Arlington Optimist Acorns Combined Junior Rifle Club (CJRC) had an extremely productive 2016-2017 season. While our team is comprised of just 15 athletes, their training, dedication, and hard work paid off both on and off the range.

On The Range

In addition to numerous local matches, Acorns athletes qualified for/competed in no less than five national championship events in smallbore rifle (.22 caliber) and precision air rifle.

Early in the season, the Acorns won the US Army Virginia State Sectional, advancing to the <u>US Army National Air Rifle Championship</u> at Ft. Benning, GA, where they turned in 4th place finishes in both the team and individual competitions. Shortly thereafter, 11 of our athletes qualified for and competed in the <u>USA Shooting National Junior Olympics</u> at the Olympic Training Center (OTC) in Colorado Springs.

The Acorns also competed in the <u>American Legion National Championship</u> tournament, earning a 2nd place team finish and qualifying four individuals in the top 15 in the country. three of those four will be traveling to the OTC this July to compete in the shoulder-to-shoulder, four- day competition for the individual national title. The Acorns also qualified two teams and two individuals to compete in the <u>Civilian Marksmanship</u> <u>Program (CMP) Junior Olympics/National Championships</u>. Ten of our athletes will be traveling to Camp Perry, OH this June for that competition.

Finally, the Acorns competed in the annual, nationwide <u>NRA Junior Rifle</u> <u>Championships</u>, earning 19 team and individual medals, including the singular distinction of NRA Junior Metric Position Smallbore National Champions.

Additionally, five of our athletes earned the CMP Junior Distinguished Badge this past year, an individual accomplishment that typically takes many years and one that most rifle athletes never attain.

Off The Range

The team had success off the range as well. In addition to team bonding over tree sales and after-match dinners, the Acorns gave back to the local junior shooting sports by sponsoring a new Junior Olympic Qualifier match for non-Acorn athletes in our area. As a result, two local athletes earned the opportunity to go to the Junior Olympics in Colorado Springs this year. Acorns athletes volunteered to help run this and other local matches during the year.

Two of our athletes obtained their NRA Junior Trainer designation by successfully completing the NRA Level 1 Coaches School. This will enable them to better assist their less experienced teammates, both on the Acorns and their local high school clubs. Also, several of our young men earned their Eagle Scout rank this season. Not to be outdone, two of our young women earned appointments to the United States Military Academy at West Point and the United States Coast Guard Academy. And while we are sad to be saying goodbye to those who are moving on, we are extremely pleased that all seven graduating seniors are pursuing higher education next year.

I could not be more proud of our athletes' work ethic and attitude; nor more thankful for our volunteer coaches. It has been a joy to work with these young people and watch them grow these past 12 months. It is truly a privilege to be associated with such a superb organization. Thank you SO much for the support of the Optimist Club of Arlington. You are a critical component to the success of our young men and women.
