The Optimist Tree Lot Planning Committee met in July to discuss and prepare for the 2020 Tree Lot Season.

The Committee did discuss and debate whether or not to have tree sales this year because of the lingering COVID issues. All members agreed to proceed and to take protections and to implement processes as the guidelines dictate. We also checked with our sports teams to ensure that they were committed to supply man power. We've received two thumbs up so far.

Therefore, the Arlington Optimist Club will proceed with the 2020 Tree Lot with opening day beginning on Friday, November 27 at noon!

This is the first year where the Optimist membership cannot support 100 percent coverage of the lot with Optimist members. We also need a volunteer(s) to commit to being a daily volunteer lot manager. Below are the responsibilities. This position can be shared. If anyone knows someone who would like to help out, please let me know.

JB Whitlow has volunteered to handle White House ornaments this year. <u>Dick McHugh</u> has handled this task for years and I am certain he would be happy to tutor.

<u>Jeff Englander</u> stepped up to be a lot captain. Accordingly, the 2020 Tree Lot Captains are Jeff, <u>Brian Kellenberger</u>, <u>Andreas Baltatzis</u> and <u>Bob Patton</u>. Thanks guys!!

<u>Barbara Nicastro</u> is leading volunteers again this year. She is already getting things organized. Thank you Barbara!

Andreas Baltatzis agreed to handle contracting the security firm. Believe it or not, we have had major theft in past years. The last 2 years, we have had a security firm watch the trees for a few hours each night. It has made a difference. The Committee approved to hire the firm again.

I will be sending an email in a few weeks asking members to provide three dates and times to work the lot. Most Optimists will only be scheduled for two shifts. If you can do three or more, please let me know.

Tree Lot Daily Manager: First, a few points -

- 1) It needs to be one person or he/she can find a substitute, if needed;
- 2) Since the tasks are daily, we find that someone who is retired works best:
- 3) Tree season begins the Friday after Thanksgiving and ends around 12/20, if not earlier.

Responsible for opening and closing lot daily. Here are the hours:

M - TH - 2:00 to 8:00 pm

Friday - Noon to 8:00 pm

Sat - Sun - 9:00 to 8:00 pm

Duties include:

- 1) Ensuring at the beginning of the shift there is cash to handle cash transactions:
- 2) Turning on the power and getting the saws ready;
- 3) Welcoming volunteers and ensuring the Optimist or Optimist designee cashier arrives;
- 4) Ensuring lot is manned;
- 5) Working closely with weekly lot captain. Lot captain is to help troubleshoot and handle problems;
- 6) Training first cashier on credit card machine; and
- 7) Close lot ensuring equipment being put back in POD, Locking POD, Turning off power and escorting cashier across the lot to Wells Fargo Bank to deposit cash in the night depository.
