
October 21: Arlington Historical Society

Appendix 2: Background on November Speakers by Frank O'Leary

November 4 - Edwin Fountain, U.S. World War I Centennial Commission, World War I - The Forgotten War

Edwin Fountain has lived in Arlington intermittently since he was four years old, and most recently since 1995. After graduating from Yorktown High School (Class of 1982) he attended the University of North Carolina, the London School of Economics, and the University of Virginia Law School. He was a litigation partner at the international law firm Jones Day in its Washington DC Office until 2015, when he left to become the first General Counsel of the American Battle Monuments Commission, a U.S. government agency headquartered here in Arlington that builds and maintains American military cemeteries and memorials around the world.

Edwin began his advocacy for a national World War I memorial in 2008, which led to his appointment as Vice Chair of the U.S. World War I Centennial Commission. Since 2014 he has led the establishment of the national World War I memorial at Pershing Park in Washington, which is scheduled to be dedicated next month and completed in 2023.

Edwin is a member of Leadership Arlington, Class of 2011. He served on the Arlington County Commission for the Arts from 2011-14. He was appointed to the Arlington County Industrial Development Authority in 2017 and was elected chairman in 2018.

November 18 - Jeffrey Washington, American Correctional Association (ACA)
America's correctional System - Can It Be Improved?

Jeffrey Washington has served as Deputy Executive Director for the American Correctional Association since August 1995. Serving under the Executive Director conducting Association business, he is responsible for liaison between the Executive Director and Association staff, and liaison to the press and media. In the absence of the Executive Director, he serves as the Executive Director, attending to Association business and making key decisions relating to the day-to-day operation of the Association and overall operations. He meets with the Executive Committee and with the Executive Director to set Association goals and objectives. He travels nationwide to promote the Association and national correctional policies. Mr. Washington has served in many positions for the American Correctional Association from 1985- present. Those positions include regional administrator; deputy administrator; administrator; director and deputy executive director.
