6/02: Dr. Mark Benbow on "Education in Old Arlington - The History of Hume

School." Frank O'Leary provides the following introduction: Dr. Mark Benbow
joined Marymount University's faculty in 2007, first serving as an adjunct, then as

an assistant professor, earning tenure and promotion to associate professor in 2018. From 1987 to 2002, Dr. Benbow worked on national security issues for the federal government. From 2003 to 2006, he was the historian at the Woodrow Wilson House Museum in Washington, DC. He also serves as Museum Director for the Arlington Historical Society and manages the Arlington Historical Museum (The Hume School). He earned his BA in history from Hanover College in Indiana in 1981 and his MA in history from Wright State University in 1983. From 1983-1987 he studied for his doctorate in American History at Ohio University under Alonzo Hamby. From 1987 until 1999 he worked towards completing his degree, finally finishing in 1999.

A Dayton, Ohio native, Dr. Benbow is a lifelong devoted fan of the Cincinnati Reds, has been happily married for almost thirty years, and is the adopted dad to a small herd of rescued dogs and cats. Since 1976 he's been a collector of metallic malted beverage containers.

06/16: Tamara Moore on "The Man Who Knew Where the Bodies Were Buried".

Ms. Moore has been invited by Frank O'Leary, who provides the following background: In 1864, a young man named James Parks, a newly emancipated slave born on the grounds of the Washington Parke Custis estate known as Arlington, was hired by the US Army for a singular purpose - to bury dead soldiers on the mansions' extensive acres. He performed this task until his death in 1929 and earned the unofficial title as the first superintendent for burials at Arlington Cemetery. It is only because of James Parks' extensive knowledge of this historic property that its restoration in the 1920's to its pre-war condition was possible. Upon his death, the Secretary of War granted special permission for James Parks to be buried at Arlington National Cemetery with full military honors - the first non-soldier so honored. Please join us at the June 16 luncheon to hear the fascinating story of the life and times of "Uncle Jim" as recounted by his great-granddaughter and distinguished local historian, Tamara Moore.
