2/02: Boss Shepherd. Local historian John Richardson, joined us



to enlighten us on the life and times of "Boss Shepherd," the man who did so much to shape the city of Washington. John Richardson wrote the book, Alexander Robey Shepherd, the Man Who Built the Nations' Capital. Shepard put flesh on the bones of the L'Enfant Plan, which in 1870 was still only lines on a map. Shepherd also consolidated the three separate parts of the District (Georgetown, Washington City, Washington County), permitting citywide legislation and development for the first time.

Shepherd's legacy today is the modern city of Washington, whose infrastructure he built in a frenetic three years from 1871-1874.
