

As Wendy explained, the Arlington Neighborhood Village has been a non-profit since 2014 and currently provides rides and other services for over 300 Arlingtonians aged 58 to 98 with the assistance of over 200 volunteers. Thank you, Frank O'Leary, for inviting her.

<u>02/15: Chief Charles Penn of the Arlington Police Department.</u> Andreas Baltatzis provides the following report: "Police Chief Andy Penn joined the Optimists at our most recent luncheon. Chief Penn shared his insights from over 30 years on the Arlington police force and his goals as Chief of Police. Chief Penn outlined his priorities for the Arlington County Police as: (1) Crime Prevention & Control, (2) Community Engagement, (3) Transportation Safety, and (4) Employee Wellness and Safety. For Transportation Safety, Chief Penn highlighted the need

for education over enforcement and the coming introduction of speeding cameras in school zones. For Employee Well-being, Chief Penn highlighted the department's commitment to employee physical and mental health. Arlington



County's main challenge is the continued shortage in police officers due to the tight labor market, competition among jurisdictions, and Arlington's refusal to lower the police force's high standards for new recruits. At the conclusion of Chief Andy Penn's remarks, on behalf of the Club, Erica Burson presented him with 14 hand-written thank-you notes sharing our thanks with the new police academy graduates (see photo left,

provided by <u>Jeff Englander</u>)". Erica adds that "There was one thank-you note for each new officer who joined the force at the end of 2022. The blank notes were circulated at the first luncheon in January. All Optimists attending signed and/or added words of encouragement to each note. Thanking new police officers is one more part of our Club's Respect for Law program. Signing and sending notes for new officers who have just finished their police academy training can be turned into an annual tradition". Thank you, Erica, for this wonderful initiative, and thank you, <u>Frank O'Leary</u>, for inviting Chief Penn.
