<u>03/15: "Arlington a Century Ago" by Peter Penczer</u>. Peter is a "self-employed tour guide and historian" who has made available many photos of the early days

of Arlington. Photo below and the following description of the meeting submitted by <u>Andreas Baltatzis</u>: "Peter Penczer presented his collection of photographs and other documents showing Arlington from 100 years ago, [such as the one below of Hoover Field in the 1920's (photo from the web)].



Peter showed some of the earliest mentions of Arlington during the name transition from Alexandria County. At that time the neighborhoods were connected by street car to Washington DC, as paved roads did not extend through the county. You could also take sightseeing airplanes rides from Washington airport, which is now the site of the Pentagon. Peter also shared the history of his own



bungalow home that was moved from its original location. Peter was able to

travel down to Florida to meet the previous owner who shared pictures of historic Arlington." Thank you, <u>Frank O'Leary</u>, for inviting him.

"The Optimist's support is helping the Acorns continue their tradition of turning out young men and women who are able to compete at the highest levels on a 'national stage'. This year the Acorns athletes earned a total of 11 invites to compete at the USA Shooting National Junior Olympic Championship (including the Women's state champion in both smallbore and Air Rifle), to be held in April at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs as well as 15 slots at the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Junior National Championship to be held in June at Camp Perry, Ohio, where they will compete against the top junior shooters from around the country."
